

We Have Made Changes

rooms (this is the large ballroom partitioned off to a smaller room to accommodate us). The meeting will be listed on the "Events" board as you walk into the hotel lobby. It will also be listed on the TV monitors. You will also find our name on the door to the meeting room. If you still cannot find the room, just ask at the front desk, and they will be happy to direct you. Incidentally, the room is located on the first floor. For those of you who have difficultly walking, you can park at the rear of the building, come in the rear door marked "Ballroom" and be steps away from our meeting room.

Last but not least, the March Party will be held March 27-29, 2009. The location will remain the same at the Masonic Temple on Euclid Ave. However, on July 31 the Trustees visited the **Wyndam Hotel** at 13th and Euclid. Hans Pohler and Roger Rhoads later met with Wyndham personnel, and assuming they agree with contract provisions, this will be our March Party **Headquarters Hotel**. The Friday **Wine** and Cheese Party as well as the Hospitality **Suite** would be at the Wyndam. The banquet would still be held at the Café Sausalito. One distinct advantage in addition to its recent remodeling is this hotel's location is that it's on Euclid Ave. just a few blocks from the Masonic with excellent public bus service along the just opened Euclid Corridor.

I think you will agree big changes have been made which will benefit the Club. Now it's up to **YOU**, the members, to show your support by attending the meetings.

Judges for 2009 March Party



Next Meetings


